

## Teacher Directions

### Preparation

- Review the **READ FIRST** page completely.
- Connect your computer to classroom speakers and a projector, screen, or interactive whiteboard (if playing from home, simply use your computer's built in speakers).
- Start the slideshow in **presentation mode** so hyperlinks and the scoreboard function correctly.
- This game must be played in Powerpoint, run from a desktop computer or laptop.

### How to Play

- Divide students into teams. Each team chooses one of the 4 colored monsters to represent their team.
- Students select a category and point value.
- Press the white 'play' icon to play the audio example (if included).
- Students state what they think the correct answer is.
- Click the 'answer' button to reveal the correct answer:
  - For correct responses, click the green 'check-mark' (score will update automatically)
  - For incorrect responses, click the red 'x' (score will update automatically)
- Continue until all questions are completed or time runs out – and declare the winning team!

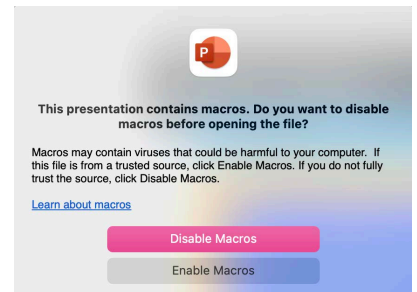

## Opening the PowerPoint File – Important!

### Opening the file on a Mac/Apple desktop computer:

- If you get any warnings about external content or external media, click 'OK!'
- You may get a warning that looks like this – click 'Enable Macros!' Macros enable the scoreboard to work.
- Be sure to view the file in presentation mode.
- *\*If the scoreboard still does not work while you are playing, please close the file and open again –making sure to accept any warnings about external content/media.*



### Opening the file on a Windows desktop computer:

- Save the zip file to your desktop. Unzip the file, and *drag the PowerPoint file to your desktop. It is crucial that you manually drag the file to your desktop. If you did it a different way, delete the file and download it again from TPT. Then drag the file to the desktop, and proceed to the next step.*
- Right click on the file, and go to 'properties'.
- At the bottom, look for 'security: this file came from another computer and might be blocked to help protect this computer'. Check (select) the box 'unblock'.
- Click 'Apply'. Now open the file and be sure to view in presentation mode!
- Accept/enable ANY warnings that may pop up about macros/external media!
